EXHIBITS: Friday, September 22, 2017-June 15, 2018 is the 2017 Photo Biennial - Through the Lens Exhibit. On display are 16 incredible images of Jeffersontown taken by Bee Buck, Silver Gelatin photography and equipment of Judy Rosati, and vintage photographic equipment from the Jeffersontown Historical Museum collection, Jesse Gilbert, Judy Rosati, and John Ulmer.
