EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 002, SERIES 2020
EXECUTIVE ORDER PERTAINING TO RESTAURANTS

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020 President Donald J. Trump declared a national state of emergency in response to the novel coronavirus, COVID-19, pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2020 Governor Andy Beshear declared a state of emergency in Kentucky in response to the first documented case of the novel coronavirus, COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Dieruf executed Emergency Order 001, Series 2020 on March 24, 2020; and

WHEREAS, whereas Governor Beshear has authorized restaurants to reopen of May 22, 2020 with 33% interior capacity and unlimited outdoor dining; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to assist restaurants by temporarily allowing them to utilize ancillary outdoor space including areas typically used for parking

NOW THEREFORE, effective on May 22, 2020, provided the Governor has formally authorized restaurants to reopen, the following guidelines shall apply to all restaurants located within Jeffersontown, Kentucky:

1. Restaurants may utilize parking spaces and other outdoor areas for outdoor dining up to a capacity equal to the original indoor and outdoor capacity of the restaurant.
2. The area to be utilized must be clearly delineated either with fencing or tape if alcoholic beverages are to be served in the area. No alcoholic beverages may be taken outside of the delineated area.
3. The area may not block any fire lane or vehicular passway, and the area shall be located and protected so as to reduce the risk of injury from vehicles or other moving hazards.
4. Canopies may be utilized, but cannot be enclosed. Up to two walls may be temporarily utilized to provide screening from weather, or to provide shade. All such structures shall conform to existing building and fire codes, all of which remain in full force and effect. If tents are utilized, they must be permitted if required under current codes, but application fees shall be waived.
5. Use of the area shall be done in conformance with all applicable health codes, CDC guidelines and state laws, regulations, and emergency orders.
6. Use of the area shall conform with applicable ADA guidelines.
7. Licensed premises may serve alcoholic beverages in the delineated area, subject to all state and local laws and regulations, and subject to the existing license of the restaurant.
8. The delineated area may not remain open beyond the established operating hours of the restaurant.
9. Music may not be played in the area.
10. Social distances and proper hygiene practices shall be followed

11. This Order shall expire without further action when restaurants are permitted to fully utilize indoor seating capacity
