The Museum has been undergoing renovations for the past several months, but on April 11th we will reopen our doors to the public. We would like to thank Mayor Dieruf, the Jeffersontown Council Members, and Jeffersontown Public Works for assisting us with all the changes. In addition to new carpet, a fresh coat of paint, new windows and doors, new lighting, and a new storage area, the City of Jeffersontown has also replaced the heat and air system in the entire building. We welcome everyone to come by and see all the updates for themselves!

EXHIBITS: Starting April 11th, Corn Island Archaeology will present an exhibit at the Jeffersontown Museum titled Falls of the Ohio River: Archaeology of Native American Settlements. Anne Bader, the owner of Corn Island Archaeology (which is located in the Conrad-Seaton House on the town square) has done extensive archaeological work throughout Jefferson County, and this exhibit will showcase some of the fruits of that labor, including displays of projectile points and other local artifacts, showing how Native Americans in the area lived over the centuries.

In conjunction with the “Grand Re-Opening” of the Museum and the onset of our latest exhibit, on Monday, April 11th at 1:00 in the meeting room of the Jeffersontown Library, Anne Bader, the owner of Corn Island Archaeology, will present a discussion on the same topic as our exhibit. Afterwards, everyone is invited to come over and view artifacts such as those that will be discussed.
